ВСТУП

LEMIS (M. OHEL) Володіння іноземними мовами особовим складом є важливим фактором реформування та розвитку Збройних Сил України, впровалження євроатлантичних стандартів і досягнення взаємосумісності зі збройними силами країн-партнерів і партнерів НАТО [4]. Особливо вагомого значення набуває опанування особовим складом англійської мови, задля чого у загальну систему підготовки військослужбовців та працівників Збройних Сил України включено мовну пілготовку, спрямовану на досягнення особовим складом відповідного цільового рівня володіння іноземною мовою для подальшого використання у службовій діяльності [1].

> У системі Міністерства оборони України рівень володіння іноземною мовою, як сукупність мовних знань, мовленнєвих навичок, вмінь та компетенцій, що визначає здатність особи до її практичного використання, оцінюється за шкалою стандартизованих мовленнєвих рівнів (далі шкала СМР), які відповідають рівням мовленнєвої компетенції згідно з мовним стандартом HATO STANAG 6001 [1]. Стандартизований мовленнєвий рівень (далі СМР) – це оцінка мовленнєвої компетентності тестуємого з одного із видів мовленнєвої діяльності (аудіювання, говоріння, читання, письмо), яка включає такі рівні: СМР 0 (Відсутність практичного вміння), СМР 0+, СМР 1 (Виживання), СМР 1+, СМР 2 (Функціональний), СМР 2+, СМР 3 (Професійний), СМР 3+, СМР 4 (Експертний), СМР 4+, 5 (Досконалий) [3].

> Метою навчальногопосібника «English reading skills development. Level 1 according to STANAG 6001» є формування компетентностей, потрібних курсантам та слухачам курсів іноземних мов вищих військових навчальних закладів для складання субтесту з читання першого рівня (СМР 1) екзамену з визначення рівня володіння іноземною мовою відповідно до стандарту НАТО STANAG 6001.

> Навчальний посібник розроблений з урахуванням положень керівних документів Міністерства оборони України щодо мовної підготовки у Збройних Силах України [1, 3, 4, 5, 6], вимог стандарту НАТО STANAG 6001 [9], рекомендацій Бюро міжнародної координації НАТО (BILC) [7, 8, 10, 11], матеріалів «Курсу підвищення кваліфікації з питань мовного тестування» Центру перепідготовки та підвищення кваліфікації Національного університету оборони України імені Івана Черняховського [2] та відповідно до програм вивчення дисципліни «Іноземна мова», розроблених кафедрою іноземних мов Військової академії (м. Одеса).

> Запропонований посібник складається з трьох розділів, кожен з яких присвячено окремому аспекту підготовки курсантів та слухачів курсів іноземних мов вищих військових навчальних закладів до субтесту з читання першого рівня (СМР 1).

Перший розділ є теоретичним та ознайомлює з основними засадами мовного тестування відповідно до мовного стандарту НАТО STANAG 6001, надає інформацію про структуру і характеристику субтесту з читання та методичні рекомендації щодо успішного складання субтесту і якісної підготовки до нього.

Другий розділ спрямований на практичну підготовку до тестування мовленнєвої компетентності з читання і поєднує автентичний текстовий матеріал з комплексом вправ, направлених на розвиток навичок читання. Для зручності використання під час аудиторної роботи, тексти, які супроводжуються вправами на контроль розуміння прочитаного, згруповані у тематичні блоки.

Третій розділ навчального посібника містить шістнадцять тестових завдань з читання, розроблених у форматі субтесту з читання першого рівня (СМР 1) екзамену з визначення рівня володіння іноземною мовою відповідно до стандарту НАТО STANAG 6001. Кожен тест складається з п'ятнадцяти текстів та п'ятнадцяти тестових завдань множинного вибору з чотирма варіантами відповідей: А, В, С, D (одне тестове завдання до одного тексту). Усі тексти підібрані з автентичних Інтернет джерел вільного доступу та стосуються повсякденних життєвих або робочих ситуацій. Текстовий матеріал містить короткі нотатки, об'яви, інструкції, вказівки, розклади, брошури, довідники, меню; прості описи людей, місць або речей, короткі географічні або біографічні відомості, інформацію про різні країни, містить часто вживану лексику та загальновідомі міжнародні терміни. Тестові завдання становлять запитання для перевірки здатності тестуємого розуміти як основну ідею текстів, так і їх фактичний зміст. летальну конкретну інформацію. Тести супроводжуються ключами з сталонними відповідями для самостійної перевірки якості їх виконання тестуємим.

Навчальний посібник «English reading skills development. Level 1 according to STANAG 6001» призначений для курсантів і слухачів курсів іноземних мов вищих військових навчальних закладів, науковопедагогічних працівників, а також всіх, хто готується до складання екзамену з визначення рівня володіння іноземною мовоювідповідно до стандарту HATO STANAG 6001 та прагне удосконалити навички BIJS CEROBA AKAREMIS ВІЙСЬКОВА А читання.

SECTION 1

EMIS (M. OFF FUNDAMENTALS OF LANGUAGE TESTING ACCORDING TO STANAG 6001

1.1. NATO Standardization Agreement No.6001

NATO Standardization Agreement No.6001 (NATO STANAG 6001) provides definition of the proficiency levels of the commonly-recognized language proficiency skills ("listening", "speaking", "reading", and "writing") to be used within the NATO and for its purposes.

Defined as an individual's unrehearsed, general language communication abilities, language proficiency skills are broken down into the following six levels:

Level 0 - No proficiency

Level 1 - Survival

Level 2 - Functional

Level 3 – Professional

Level 4 – Expert

Level 5 – Highly-articulate native [9].

NATO STANAG 6001 also describes Standardized Language Profile (SLP) formed by 4 digits with plus (+) indicators when applicable which represent the four language proficiency skills in the following sequence:

Skill L – Listening;

Skill S – Speaking;

Skill **R** – Reading;

Skill W – Writing [9].

For example, SLP 3321 means Level 3 in Listening, Level 3 in Speaking, Level 2 in Reading and Level 1 in Writing.

Participating NATO nations have adopted the table of language proficiency levels for the purpose of:

- a) Communicating language requirements for international staff appointments.
- 6) Recording and reporting, in international correspondence, measures of language proficiency.
- B) Comparing national standards through a standardized table while preserving each nation's right to maintain its own internal proficiency standards [9].

For instance, the Overview of Language Proficiency Levels provides the list of the following examples of the military tasks that can be performed by the personnel with Language Proficiency Level 1:

- ask for basic information at a checkpoint, such as name, destination, and identification papers;
- understand the gist of announcements, short radio messages and written notices;
- perform familiar tasks such as at the doctor's, arranging transportation, cbkoba akaf providing first aid or writing a short note [10].

1.2. Language proficiency testing in the Armed Forces of Ukraine

The organization of language testing in the Armed Forces of Ukraine is governed by the requirements of a number of guideline documents, namely:

- 1. "Project for the Basic Principles of the Language Training for Personnel in the System of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine" as of August 8, 2019.
- 2. "Project for the Methodological Recommendations on the Language Testing Organization in the System of the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine" as of August 8, 2019.

The Ukrainian English Language Test Specifications have been developed by the Scientific Language Testing Center of the National Defence University of Ukraine named after Ivan Cherniakhovsky in accordance with NATO STANAG 6001.

The Ukrainian Ministry of Defence officially recognizes only the versions of the Ukrainian STANAG 6001 English Language Test.

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Test Specifications and the test variants have been designed in full accordance with STANAG 6001 (Edition 5) and the descriptors of the language proficiency levels.

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Test Specifications have been designed in accordance with the theoretical and methodological language testing principles and provide the basis for the Ukrainian STANAG 6001 English language test development.

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 test fully complies with the BILC (Bureau for International Language Co-operation) requirements.

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Test measures language skills, NOT professional competence. The four language skills – listening, reading, writing and speaking – are tested separately for all levels.

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Test is a two-level one for Levels 1-2. The test consists of four subtests, testing the four language skills:

Reading (60 minutes)

Listening (about 45 minutes)

Writing (40 minutes)

Speaking (about 15 minutes per candidate)

Each skill is assessed independently of the other skills.

Candidates are assigned levels on a band scale from 0 to 2. Intermediate levels (pluses) are introduced for levels 0 to 2. If a candidate is rated at a given level on this scale, it is assumed that he/she has covered all the language skills required at the preceding lower levels.

The candidates can receive a language proficiency certificate in accordance with the STANAG 6001 Test results [2, pp. 13, 14]. BIACHKOBA

1.3. Testing language proficiency in reading Level 1

1.3.1. Description of language proficiency levels (0-1) in reading

NATO STANAG 6001 gives the following description of language proficiency levels in reading:

LEVEL 0 (No proficiency)

No practical ability to read the language. Consistently misunderstands or cannot comprehend the written language at all.

LEVEL 0+ (Memorized proficiency)

Can recognize all the letters in an alphabetic system and high-frequency elements of a syllabary or a character system. Able to read some or all of the following: numbers, isolated words and phrases, personal and place names, street signs, office and shop designations; however, may misinterpret even these texts. May be able to read phrases that are memorized or strongly supported by context, but cannot read at the sentence level.


LEVEL 1 (Survival)


Can read very simple connected written material, such as unambiguous texts that are directly related to everyday survival or workplace situations. Texts may include short notes; announcements; highly predictable descriptions of people, places, or things; brief explanations of geography, government, and currency systems simplified for non-natives; short sets of instructions and directions (application forms, maps, menus, directories, brochures, and simple schedules). Understands the basic meaning of simple texts containing high frequency structural patterns and vocabulary, including shared international terms and cognates (when applicable). Can find some specific details through careful or selective reading. Can often guess the meaning of unfamiliar words from simple context. May be able to identify major topics in some higher level texts. However, may misunderstand even some simple texts [9].


1.3.2. Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Reading subtest Level 1

The Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Test includes a two-level Reading subtest. The Reading subtest testing reading skills for Level 1 consists of 15 short texts and 15 tasks: one task for each text.

All the tasks in the Ukrainian STANAG 6001 Reading subtest are multiple-choice items which ask a question or establish a situation for a response and include four options (A, B, C, D) from which the correct answer is selected. BIICHKOBA AKA







Multiple-choice testing terminology

ITEM – an entire "question". It may be considered a miniature test.

STEM – the initial part of the item: either a partial sentence to be completed, a question, or several statements leading to a question or incomplete phrase.

OPTIONS – choices from which the examinee must select an answer.

KEY – the right answer. The one option that is distinctly correct or more suitable than the others.

DISTRACTORS – the incorrect options.

ORIENTATION, or SETTING – the context presented at the beginning of the item to provide a fuller understanding of the situation presented for testing.

TEXT – the written or spoken material providing the content on which the item is focused [11].

Texts associated with language proficiency Level 1

It is obvious that for testing reading skills for a definite level, the texts that match that level should be used.

According to the Overview of Reading Text Characteristics by Level, the texts appropriate for Level 1 are characterized as "simple short sentences with simple vocabulary. Sentences may be resequenced without changing the meaning of the text. Text organization is loose without much cohesion, but follows societal norms" [11].

The above-mentioned STANAG 6001 reading descriptor identifies the content of Level 1 texts as the following:

- short notes:
- announcements:
- highly predictable descriptions of people, places, or things;

- brief explanations of geography, government, and currency systems simplified for non-natives;
 - short instructions/directions [9].

Thus, the sources for Level 1 texts can be:

- newspaper announcements:
- sales advertisements:
- bulletin board information:
- invitations:
- tourist information:
- public address system announcements;
- application forms;
- maps;
- menus:
- directories:
- brochures;
- simple schedules.

Example of Level 1 text

We are currently looking to fulfil part-time Teaching jobs in London to teach Dutch! We are looking for someone who is available on the Sunday mornings weekly. Your main duties will be teaching Dutch and entertaining the children, with supporting them where needed.

Text editing recommendations

As all the texts utilized in the process of testing reading skills should be authentic, ideally, they should not be edited at all. However, some texts may still require slight changes in order to fit the test specifications.

For example, a text can be shortened in case the original one is too long. Also, the names of celebrities and elected officials in a text can be substituted with their titles to prevent the reading material from becoming outdated. Besides, acronyms or abbreviations that are unlikely widely known by non-native speakers should be replaced with full organizations' titles. Possible typographical errors in texts should be corrected, but their original grammar or style should not be improved. In general, in the process of editing texts for testing reading skills purposes as much authenticity as possible should be maintained [11].

Tasks for texts associated with language proficiency Level 1

The tasks developed for testing reading skills should correspond to the language proficiency level of the texts they accompany.

According to the Overview of Reading Text Characteristics by Level, while reading a text of Level 1, the reader's purpose is to "orient oneself by identifying CHKOBA AKAP topics and main ideas" [11].

STANAG 6001 reading descriptor states that the reader's task is to "understand the basic meaning of simple texts", "find some specific details" and "identify major topics in some higher level texts" [9].

Thus, the appropriate tasks for the texts associated with language proficiency Level 1 may include identifying the main idea/topicor finding some facts/details.

Example of the task to identify the main idea/topic of the text

Trick or Treat! Join us For a Halloween Celebration At the Mullville Family's House October 31st at 6:00 pm 4005 Willison Street, Minneapolis

Example of the task to find some facts/details in the text

After three years in Detroit, Henry returned to his family farm. He remained on the farm until he was thirty years old. But he was not a real farmer. He was a machine man. A nearby farmer, for example, had bought a small steam engine to be used in farming. The machine did not work correctly. Henry agreed to try to fix it. At the end of just one day, Henry knew everything about the machine. And he made it work again.

1.3.3. Recommendations on improving Reading subtest score

Knowing the test structure and its characteristics is helpful for developing preparation methods for successful passing the Reading subtest. Here are some recommendations that can help a candidate to increase the reading test results.

Advice on test performing

First of all, the two different types of tasks in a reading test should be borne in mind, as successful performance of each one requires an appropriate technique. Thus, before reading the text itself, it is recommended to read the task and make sure you bKOBA AKAF understand it correctly. Determine the task type before deciding on your strategy.

The task to identify the main idea/topic of the text can be carried out with the help of skimming technique. Skimming is a short glance at the text to identify the general idea of the context. Finding and underlining the topic sentence or sentences help to understand the main idea. While the question is answered, it is recommended to look through the text once more to identify the words or expressions that support your choice.

The task to find some facts/details in the text requires scanning – the ability to locate information in the text quickly. Before doing it, go through the options and underline the key words, then use scanning to locate specific keywords or phrases related to the question in the text.Read the surrounding text in detail to find the details you are looking for; choose the answer that fits best.

For doing all types of tasks, it is extremely important to understand the question before reading the options.

All options should be analyzed. Even if you think you know the correct answer, always check that the others are not appropriate. Each option should be checked carefully as quite often all four options in the task are referred to in some way in the text, but only one is right.

It should be kept in mind that the information in the options may be rephrased. The key words and expressions are usually paraphrased, so spot and use them correctly: think of their synonyms and antonyms. Besides, be careful with the options which contain words from the text: they can have a different meaning.

It is not recommended to rely on your background knowledge while doing the reading test as the information in the text may differ from the standard facts you know. Never make guesses, predictions and your own conclusions, check the answers you consider the right ones against the text and find in it the evidence for them.

In case you have to choose the right option to complete the sentence given in the task, read the whole sentence carefully to make sure that the whole sentence (both parts of it) agrees with the information in the text.

The strict time limits for the test should be kept in mind. It is better to leave difficult questions and return to them when the rest of the tasks are completed.

Be careful with filling in the answer sheet and remember to do it right away as no additional time is given for it.

Advice on developing reading skills

Successful performance during the reading test requires not only the knowledge of the test itself, but also thorough preparation and constant reading practice. However, just reading in English is not enough for receiving high test score. Reading while preparing for taking a test should be active and meaningful.

It's obvious that developing reading techniques of skimming and scanning is of the crucial importance for improving reading skills. These two techniques are closely related to speed reading which requires special attention and regular practice inchkoba akai as strict time limits is the most challenging aspect of the test for many candidates.

Moreover, skimming and scanning techniques don't require understanding the whole text and knowing all the words. Thus, ability to elicit, guess or predict the meaning of the unknown words from the context is significant.

The lack of grammar and vocabulary can often be a cause of poor reading test performing. The matter is that for excellent reading skills, it is not enough to know just the meaning of the words, it is also principal to know their usage: collocations, set expressions, phraseological units with them. Due to the fact that the same information from the text can be paraphrased in the tasks, in the process of enhancing vocabulary, special attention should be devoted to synonyms and antonyms.

While practicing reading, grammar aspect should be also taken into account, as good grammar skills are needed for paraphrasing ability.

Among the exercises and activities that contribute to building strong reading skills, the following ones are highly recommended:

- looking through the text and finding an appropriate title for it;
- choosing headlines for passages;
- making a plan of the text:
- identifying topic sentences of each paragraph;
- underlining the key words in the text;
- explaining the underlined words;
- making timelines of the events described in the text:
- answering comprehension questions;
- true or false statements:
- writing a summary of the text;
- constructing a graphic organizer or a mental map of the text;
- chart completion with factual information (dates, numbers etc.);

Nikola Tesla

Nikola Tesla was born on July 10, 1856 in Smiljan, Croatia. His mother was an inventor and his father was a priest. His parents wanted him to become a priest like his father, but he had a passion for studying Science. He studied Science at the University of Prague and then started working for the Central Telephone Exchange in Budapest.

At the age of 28, Tesla decided to go to America in pursuit of his desire to create new inventions. Upon moving to the United States, Tesla started working with the famous American inventor, Thomas Edison. While working together, a disagreement occurred between Tesla and Edison and Tesla eventually left Edison to create his own company called the Tesla Electric Light Company. In 1893, Tesla's AC electrical system was selected over Edison's at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago. In 1896, Tesla created the world's first hydroelectric power plant, which brought power to the city of Buffalo, New York. During 1899 to 1900, Tesla continued to experiment with electricity and radio frequency magnetic waves in his laboratory based in Colorado. In 1900, Tesla started construction of a "Wireless Broadcasting System" tower on Long Island, New York. The aim of constructing this tower was to connect telephone and telegraph services, as well as broadcast images, reports, and weather information to every corner of the world. But the funding of the project had to be cut and the tower had to be sold off.

You would be surprised to know that Tesla had over 800 different patents to his name, and despite that he was penniless. Ridicule from his own colleagues, lack of recognition by the public, drove him into a life of depression and self-imposed exile. It is absolutely ironical that the man who invented the modern world died in a poverty in a lonely hotel room on January 7, 1943 at the age of 86.

Steven Paul Jobs

Steven Paul Jobs, the chief founder of Apple Computer, was born in San Francisco, California (February 24, 1955). His parentsgave their son up for adoption. Jobs was adopted by Clara and Paul Jobs. They had another child named Mona Simpson. He came to know about his biological parents at the age of twenty seven.

In his childhood, Steve Jobs worked on electronics with Paul in the family garage. His father showed him how to take apart and reconstruct electronics. This is how his interest in electronics grew up. He was a brilliant student in school. Later, he studied in Homestead High School in Silicon Valley and Reed College in Portland, Oregon.

In the year 1974 Steve Jobs joined as a video game designer in the company named Atari, where he worked for several months. Then, he left the company in order to find spiritual enlightenment in India.

Later in 1976, Jobs and Wozniak started Apple Computer (in his family garage). Jobs was only 21 years old at that time. Jobs and Wozniak sold Volkswagen bus and scientific calculator respectively to collect fund. Wozniak coined the idea of a series of user-friendly personal computers. Jobs took the charge of marketing. Apple I was sold in 1976. The very next year saw the success of Apple II, which was followed by advent of Macintosh in 1984. Apple Computer became a publicly traded company in 1980. Jobs along with Steve Wozniak received National Medal of Technology in 1985. Steve Jobs suffered from pancreatic cancer and died in 2011.

Marie Curie

A university said students will not lose marks for language mistakes. Cherry blossoms in Japan bloomed at their earliest in 600 years. Blossoms in Kyoto peaked on the 26th of March. This was a day earlier than the previous record set in 1409. Data on Kyoto's cherry blossoms go back 1,200 years to the year 812. Japan's imperial court wrote about the blooms in diaries. Japan had much warmer weather this year. Meteorologists say this is because of climate change. They say this is making plants blossom earlier than normal.

Cherry blossoms are important in Japanese culture. People look at cherryblossom forecasts. The blossoms are called "sakura" in Japan. People go to famous cherry blossom spots to have picnics. The blossoms give Japan an important economic lift each spring. A Japanese newspaper explained their importance. It wrote: "Sakura has deeply influenced Japanese culture for centuries....Their fragility is seen as a symbol of life, death and rebirth."

Woodland gives city kids better mental health

Researchers say city woodland gives children better mental health. Children who experience the great outdoors also have better thinking skills. The researchers said their research helped them to understand that the natural environment is "an important protective factor for a child's cognitive development and mental health". They said seeing and hearing the sounds of nature gives children in cities psychological benefits.

The four-year study involved 3,568 children at 31 schools in London. Researchers calculated how woodland, parks, and "blue space" like rivers, lakes and the sea, affected children's health. Children who visited woodland every day scored higher on memory-based tests. They also had a 17 per cent lower risk of behavioural problems.
